

Affective ratings of food and non-food stimuli in AN and NP

Experiences were assessed by emotion dimensions according to Lang et al. (2008). [This procedure was adopted due to another emotional paradigm (intimacy: Maier et al. (2019)) of the multimodal study (DFG JO 744/2-1).]

Significance according to t-tests, two-sided.



The group of anorexia nervosa (AN) patients experienced increased arousal (p < 0.001) during food presentation compared to nonpatients (NP) and decreased valence (p < 0.001).
